

Key Vocabulary		
pulse	The regular heartbeat of the music; its steady beat.	
rhythm	Long and short sounds or patterns that happen over the pulse	
melody	The tune of the piece of music	
compose	To write α piece of music.	
reggae	A style of popular music with a strongly accented subsidiary beat, originating in Jamaica.	
tempo	The speed at which a piece of music should be played.	
improvise	To compose and perform a piece of music at the same time	
dynamics	The variation in loudness between notes or phrases of a piece of music.
