



Key Vocabulary

primary colours	Primary colours include red, blue and yellow. Primary colours cannot be mixed from other colours.
secondary colours	Colour combinations created by the equal mixture of two primary colours.
texture	How something feels when it is touched.
shade	Where an artist adds black to a colour to darken it down.
pattern	An arrangement of lines or shapes, especially a design in which the same shape is repeated at regular intervals over a surface.
print	Transferring an image from one surface to another, often paper or fabric.
kaleidoscope	Optical device consisting of mirrors that reflect images of bits of coloured glass in a symmetrical geometric design through a viewer.

How do I mix paints to make secondary colours?

I can name the primary colours: red, yellow and blue. I can mix primary colours to make secondary colours. I can say which two primary colours are needed to mix each of the secondary colours.

How can I apply knowledge of colour mixing when painting?

I can choose a suitable brush for the marks I want to make. Bigger brushes are best for the primary colours. Smaller brushes may be helpful for mixing secondary colours. I can clean my paintbrush to change colours.

How can I explore colours when printing?

I can print with objects applying a suitable layer of paint to the surface.

How can I experiment with paint mixing to make a range of secondary colours?

I can overlap paint to mix new colours. I can use blowing to create a paint effect. I can make paint colours darker or lighter in different ways eg. Adding water or adding a lighter colour.

How can I apply my painting skills when working in the style of an artist?

I can create a piece of work in the style of Clarice Cliff and Jasper Johns.
